The Village Improvement Association of Doylestown has selected Fieldstone Farm at 1515 Sugar Bottom Road in Furlong as the 35th Bucks County Designer House & Gardens. Nestled within 100 acres of rolling pastures, Fieldstone Farm is centered around a stone-and-stucco farmhouse featuring a 1780s summer kitchen and an exceptional master suite. Additionally, on the extensive grounds, are stables, a charming three-story jockey cottage and a swimming pool.

Following an Empty House Event on Sunday, February 28, 2010, selected creative and talented interior designers and landscapers will begin in March to renovate, restore and remodel this working equestrian estate.
